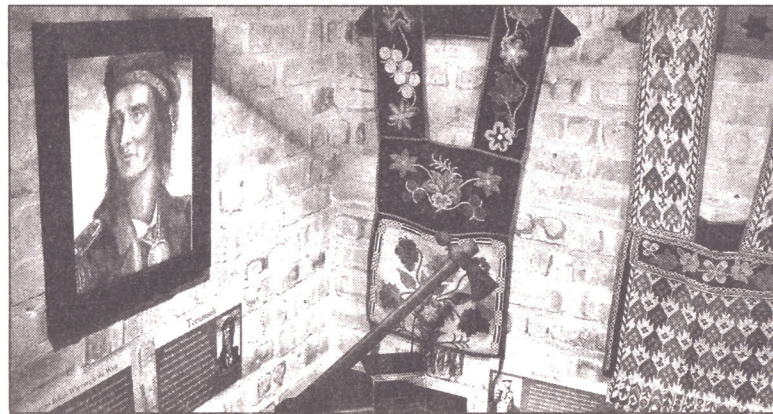

## Pick of the week

“War of 1812: Fighting for Their Homeland” looks at the local impact of the war and the Native Americans who fought during the 2½-year conflict, such as Shawnee war chief Tecumseh, who organized a confederation of Indian nations to fight against the U.S., and Seneca chief Red Jacket, who sided with the Americans against the British and British-Canadian settlers. Maps, document reproductions, slide shows and items from the museum’s permanent collection offer an overview of the war and significant events, including Chicago’s Battle of Fort Dearborn.
